Letter from the President

This is my final letter as president of CLASS and the Arc of Greater Lawrence. I am retiring at the end of June after 37 years working for CLASS, 27 years as president.

I began working for CLASS in 1980 as director of programs, serving 14 sons and daughters.

Community referrals and recognition for specializing in serving individuals with disabilities, once restricted to state institutions, helped us grow.

During my tenure I've worked with many dedicated staff members, Board of Directors members and community supporters - all a major part of our success - committed to making the lives of the individuals we serve as meaningful and as enriching as possible.

During our 41 years CLASS has grown beyond Greater Lawrence to serve most of the communities in northeastern Massachusetts. We are a proud chapter of the Arc of Massachusetts, as an advocate for those we serve and their families, and we liaise with both local and state governments to advocate for services critical to agencies across Massachusetts.



Today CLASS serves almost 500 individuals and families in programs. It has been personally rewarding to be part of CLASS's growth and to see the benefit our agency has brought to so many people.

However, state and federal funding is not keeping pace with the needs of those we serve. At no time in my 37 years at CLASS have I witnessed the financial pressure state agencies are facing to maintain quality services. This is a major concern, something we must all face and address in the months and years ahead.

Together, we have successfully supported the closing of many state institutions. Neighborhoods where individuals live and work have accepted them as part of their community life; corporations increasingly support their employment. We have created opportunities for individuals to be valued and respected.

Join with us as we celebrate and continue the good work started years ago by parents with vision. The continued advocacy on behalf of families and their sons and daughters is something I will always stay committed to.
